THE JUSTIN MILLER PRIZE

The Board of Editors takes this opportunity of announcing that the winner of last year's Justin Miller prize—a \$100 United States war bond was James A. Nelson—who wrote on the subject "Survival of Actions in Montana."

Justin Miller, Associate Justice of the United States Court of Appeals, Washington, D. C., was a member of the first graduating class of Montana State University Law School in 1913. He delivered the commencement address at Montana State University in 1941, at which time he received an honorary Doctor of Laws degree. The leading article in the Spring 1941 issue of the Montana Law Review, "Uniform Criminal Law Administration," was contributed by Justice Miller.
