THE JUSTIN MILLER PRIZE

The Board of Editors has the pleasure to announce that the Justin Miller prize, a \$100 United States savings bond, will again be awarded to the best student note published in this issue. No award was made last year due to the limited enrollment in the Law School.

Justin Miller, former Associate Justice of the United States Court of Appeals, and now President, National Association of Broadcasters, Washington, D. C., was a member of the first graduating class of Montana State University Law School in 1913. He delivered the commencement address at Montana State University in 1941, at which time he received an honorary Doctor of Laws degree. The leading article in the Spring 1941 issue of the Montana Law Review, "Uniform Criminal Law Administration," was contributed by Justice Miller.
